## Significant Roles



### As precinct officers:

**You can recruit new precinct members!**

**Attend precinct meetings!**

**Join others and attend school board meetings or county council meetings!**

**Participate in election integrity efforts by working at the polls!**

**Participate in get-out-the-vote efforts for primaries and elections!**

## Why a precinct strategy?

Because neighbor-to-neighbor works!

XXX County is divided into \_\_\_\_ precincts. Each of those should elect an Executive Committeeperson AND a Precinct President, and then go on to elect other officers and members.

The purpose of this brochure is to describe those officers' responsibilities to the precinct.

**Secretary:** The precinct secretary writes down the "minutes" of precinct meetings. That's simply writing down who attended, who made motions and seconds, and what business was completed in the meeting. The secretary is also tasked with keeping the membership records for the precinct. Keeping up with who is on the different committees is also an important part of the secretary's role.

**Vice-President:** If the precinct president cannot attend a meeting, the vice-president will preside over the meeting and conduct the business. It's not mandatory, but a handbook of Robert's Rules can be mighty helpful! When the committeeperson cannot attend a county meeting, the president is the automatic "proxy" to attend and vote. Precinct presidents can give their proxy to the vice-president if they are also unable to attend.

**Treasurer:** If a precinct takes donations for an activity, or for donating to the county party, the treasurer should keep careful records. If the funds are to be used within the precinct, care should be taken to have transparency and accuracy. If the funds are earmarked for the county organization, the treasurer is responsible for conveying them to the county party treasurer.

## Precincts Are "Classrooms"

You may have heard it said that our precincts are where we can "grow" delegates to the county convention (every two years), new county leadership, and candidates for elected office!

It's true!

You and your neighbors can learn and experience grassroots involvement and gain the skills to be a delegate or a candidate for elected office; you will learn the importance of service, of staying "grounded" and responsive to the folks in your area.

Representative democracy can be "noisy," but our discussions and votes ensure that we work together to preserve our freedoms and our Constitution.
