## An Important Role



### As precinct president you can:

**Recruit new precinct members!**

**Schedule precinct meetings!**

**Organize members to attend school board meetings and county council meetings!**

**Hold joint precinct meetings and invite speakers! Make it fun! Educational!**

**Participate in election integrity efforts by working at the polls!**

**Participate in get-out-the-vote efforts for Constitution-loving candidates!**

## Why a precinct strategy?

Because neighbor to neighbor works!

(NAME) County is divided into (XXX) precincts. Each of those should elect an Executive Committeeperson AND a Precinct President, and then go on to elect other officers and members. As president, you have the automatic vote if the executive committeeperson cannot attend the county meeting. But that's not all you do!

Each precinct is an opportunity for grassroots involvement. Our precinct strategy is to grow the number of members in each community. But it's not just about numbers!

Here are some of the important goals for our precinct presidents:

- The president can call (schedule) precinct meetings and preside over them.
- The president will preside over the election of the other precinct officers and delegates to the county convention.
- As president, you will want to recruit new members and grow your precinct – help is available to you.
- As more members join, you will be able to delegate some tasks: some members will be interested in school board matters and others will be interested in attending county council meetings. They can report to the other precinct members.
- Other members can monitor the efforts of elected officials to represent us, hold them accountable, and preserve our freedoms.
- As president, be alert to those in your precinct who may be interested in serving on county boards and commissions, in party leadership or are interested in running for elected office.

## Precincts Are Classrooms

Our precincts are where we can “grow” delegates to the county convention (every two years), new county leadership, and candidates for elected office!

Members learn and experience grassroots involvement and gain the skills to be candidates for elected office; they'll learn the importance of staying “grounded” and responsive to the folks in their area. As president, you and the executive committeeperson have the responsibility to make sure the precinct's voice is heard. Representative democracy can be “messy,” but our discussions and votes ensure that we work together to preserve our freedoms and our Constitution.
